THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

THE YEAR OF MERCY

During this upcoming year we will frequently be hearing about the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. The reason for the Church's emphasis upon this theme is that last Lent Pope Francis declared that the period beginning on December 8 of this year until the Solemnity of Christ the King on November 20, 2016 (the end of the Liturgical Year) will be the Year of Mercy.

It isn't surprising that this pope who has emphasized by word and example the importance of exercising compassion and care for all those in need should invite the whole Church to take up this ministry with renewed effort.

To be sure, the idea of the works of mercy is not a new theme in the life of the Church nor are we unaware of their importance. We are reminded of this fact every time we encounter Matthew 25 with its powerful image of the Son of Man on Judgment Day separating "all the nations" before him either to "eternal punishment" or to "eternal life" according to whether or not they have fed the hungry, given drink to the thirsty, welcomed the stranger, clothed the naked, cared for the sick, or visited prisoners. If we add to this list the action of burying the dead, we will have the traditional seven corporal works of mercy.

As we all know, our awareness of the importance of a certain way of thinking or acting is not the same as putting that principle into action. For each of us, therefore, the Year of Mercy invites us to do two things: first, to look at our actions - and not just our intentions - and see how often and how well we practice the works of mercy; and second, to turn that knowledge into action and to expand our outreach to those in need.

Our parishes and organizations such as the Knights will certainly assist us in these efforts so that both as individuals and as Christian communities we can be known as men and women of mercy.

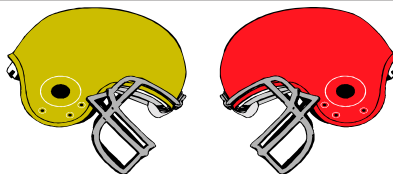
