CHAPLINS CORNER

I imagine that most Catholics in the United States have heard about the third edition of the Roman Missal which will be implemented on the First Sunday of Advent. This edition is a new translation of the Latin text which was promulgated at the end of the Second Vatican Council, although some new prayers have been added. At this time there is only a new English translation; the translations now in use in other languages will remain the same.

The reason for this change for the English-speaking world goes back to Blessed John Paul II who felt that the English translation did not adhere closely enough to the original Latin and that too much in the original text had been omitted. The prayers in the third edition will therefore be longer and their linguistic style will be more complex, as is typical of the Latin.

For example, the congregation's response to the priest's greeting, "The Lord be with you," will be changed from "And also with you" to "And with your spirit." The Latin text has always read "And with your spirit" (Et cum spiritu tuo), but it had been simplified in the English translation. As you encounter similar changes in the new translation and wonder "Why did they change that?" the answer will often be that the English is now closer to the original Latin.

In the new Missal there are no changes in the structure of the Mass nor are there any new parts to the Mass. In addition, these changes do not affect the Liturgy of the Word since the Lectionary has not been retranslated. Most of the changes therefore affect the prayers which the priest uses. In addition, in the presentation of the new Missal the Church is encouraging a greater use of chant and of hymns that are

drawn from the antiphons given for each Mass.

These changes in the prayers of the Mass give us an opportunity to renew our appreciation for the Mass. Very often what has become familiar no longer grabs our attention and therefore does not enter our hearts. Since the prayers will sound new to us, we will have to listen carefully, and this is a good thing. As the mysteries of our faith are presented in new words, perhaps we will hear some things as if for the first time, and not only our ears but also our minds and hearts will be opened.
