**THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

In some of his public statements as our new Holy Father, Pope Francis I has warned of dangers facing the Church today and he has pointed out the direction he would like to take the Church in the future. In this brief column I would like to talk about one danger and one recommendation made by the pope.

One of the dangers that Francis has spoken about is narcissism in the Church. This isn't a problem that we often hear about in connection with the Church, although it is real enough. Narcissism refers, of course, to a concentration on one's self and one's interests, almost to the exclusion of all others. Such a vice is certainly contradictory for a community that has the commandments to love God and neighbor as the foundation of its religious and social behavior. Nevertheless, it isn't difficult to find examples of this problem throughout the Church.

In multi-ethnic parishes, for example, pastors sometimes have the problem of convincing each group within the parish that they are not being slighted in favor of some other group. The obligation to treat everyone fairly needs to be met with a desire to serve rather than to be served. Unfortunately, any kind of parish group can ignore the overall well being of the parish for the sake of satisfying its own needs and agenda. In such cases we can rightly speak of group narcissism.

Narcissism can also affect a whole parish when it forgets that it is part of a diocese and, beyond that, part of the universal Church. Whether a parish is rich or poor, large or small, it should be able to give visible evidence of its connection, both spiritually and materially, to the whole Church.

The pope's criticism of narcissism is directly connected to his emphasis on developing a Church that always shows its concern for the poor and for those in need. The pope's own simple life style stands as a visible call for all the members of the Church to adopt this priority in their own lives. In following this call we are most of all responding to the example of Christ whose mission was always to those most in need.

May we together build a Church of humility and compassion which all will see as a beacon to guide them in their lives.

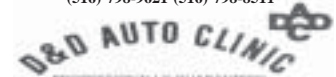

## CHESS GAMES CAN HELP

It's been shown that intellectually stimulating activities are good for the gray matter. It may also be good for the white matter.

Researchers at Rush University Medical Center and Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago found that reading, writing or playing games such as chess and checkers may help keep the area of the brain known as white matter healthy. White matter transmits information throughout the central nervous system and the brain. Keeping white matter healthier helps preserve the structural integrity of the entire brain, researchers said. In their study of 152 participants with an average age of 81 and without signs of dementia, those who participated in what researchers called "more frequent cognitive activity in late life" displayed healthier brain patterns.
