## THE CHAPLIN'S CORNER

More than any other time of year, September feels like a time of transition. We leave behind the summer with its opportunities, I hope, for more time with family and for leisure, and we return to our normal schedule. As I look back upon this past summer, three demonstrations of people's faith remain in my memory.

In early July I had the privilege of leading a parish pilgrimage to Spain and Portugal. There were many highlights during this trip, but the devotion of the pilgrims at Fatima and Santiago de Compostela are worth recalling. Fatima needs no introduction, for it is one of the great Marian shrines in Christendom; and Santiago, which honors St. James the Apostle, has been a destination for pilgrims since medieval times. I am happy to say that both shrines still attract thousands of pilgrims every week and that the devotion of the people is obvious in the fervor of their prayers and in the sacrifices many have made to reach these shrines.

This is especially true of Santiago where many of the pilgrims have reached there after walking some portion of the Camino de Santiago or "The Way,' which is the ancient pilgrim route to the shrine. Some of the pilgrims we spoke with set out hundreds of miles away from the shrine, but were happy to have made the journey.

My final experience of the power of people's faith was at the Mass of Ordination for Fr. Vian Ntegerijimana at his home parish in Kinanira, Uganda. Fr. Vian had done his Pastoral Year at St. William's, and I was able to participate in this important event in his life. The ordination attended by almost 4,000 people, most of whom walked miles to get to the church. The joy and enthusiasm of that Mass was unforgettable and inspiring in every way.

Seeing the faith in action among the people of Uganda and at these shrines reminded me that our Catholic faith still inspires and sustains millions of people throughout the world. Here at home it can sometimes be discouraging for both priests and lay people to see so many people putting their faith on the back burner so they can be busy with other things. Christ has taught us, however, that being a Christian means putting God at the center of one's life, not in the corner, and that the rewards of such a sacrifice far surpass anything we may have given up. Through prayer and action may we always be pilgrims journeying closer to God throughout all our lives.
