THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

I suspect that most Catholics, without much trouble, could give a good definition of Lent. They might even be able to list prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as Lenten practices promoted by the Church. I don't think, however, that most Catholics would be able to define the Easter season as easily.

Yes, this season comprises the fifty days after Easter, and it certainly celebrates the resurrection of our Lord, but is there anything in particular that the Church asks us to do during this season? What, for example, are the Easter equivalents of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving?

I would like to suggest that if Lent is dedicated to repentance and conversion, Easter is a special time for the pursuit of true joy. Easter is the time for us to celebrate the gift of life that Christ now shares with us because of his passion, death, and resurrection. It is a time for us to uncover in our own lives how we can use this gift to its fullest. Where, for example, have we settled for lesser, more dubious joys which leave us unsatisfied when Christ would give us a taste of eternity itself? When, for example, have we defined joy solely in terms of our own interests and desires and forgotten that joy begins when we become givers and not just receivers of the good things in this life?

The pursuit of true joy is not necessarily easy or without sacrifice, but it is a task that others might envy. During the Easter season we are given a goal that offers us a kingdom of peace, love, and true life that extends from this world into the next. During the days after Easter we do not cease to pray "Lord, have mercy," and ask forgiveness for our sins, for the themes of Lent are never to be ignored. At the same time, however, during the Easter season we must shout all the louder, "Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia !"
