CHAPLINS CORNER

Many years ago the Catholic Church and pro-life activists of all denominations foresaw that the laws legalizing abortion would one day become laws requiring abortion. In other words, the concept of "freedom of choice" would eventually allow only one choice.

This prediction recently took one step closer to complete fulfillment with a new "preventive services mandate from the Department of Health and Human Services requiring private health plans to cover female sterilization and all drugs and devices approved by the FDA as contraceptives. This even includes drugs which can attack an unborn child before and after implantation in the womb. Unfortunately, as Cardinal Daniel Dinardo, chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities, has pointed out, the present religious exemption to such a mandate is so narrow that Catholic institutions could act in accord with Catholic teachings only if they cease hiring and serving non-Catholics.

Fortunately, there is a bill before Congress, the Respect for Rights of Conscience Act, which would prevent such a mandate from ignoring religious convictions. As Cardinal DiNardo said in a July 22 letter supporting the bill,

"Those who sponsor, purchase and issue health plans should not be forced to violate their deeply held moral and religious convictions in order to take part in the health care system or provide for the needs of their families or their employees. To force such an unacceptable choice would be as much a threat to universal access to health care as it is to freedom of conscience."

It makes no sense that the Administration is simultaneously trying to bring health care to more Americans than ever before while endangering the survival of institutions that provide that health care. Unfortunately, as long as pregnancy is treated by HHS as a disease and the rights of conscience are disregarded, this contradiction will remain. The prolife activities of the Knights of Columbus have been of great value in this struggle, and your letters to Congress and to the President might turn the light of reason and true freedom of choice upon this problem.






